1. PREPARATION PHASE

The preparation of this activity began about one month before the expected date of the workshop on 19, 20 and 21 October 2010. It consisted of:

- Development of terms of reference
- Development of the Workshop Agenda
- Identification and finalization of the list of participants: The selection of participants was made on the basis of the CDM projects portfolio and the current phase of these projects. He was about inviting to the workshop, persons at the stage of PIN to help them reach the PDD Stage. In a second step, all companies not listed in the projects portfolio and showing a potential in terms of development of CDM projects, have also been invited so as to arouse in them project ideas and put their ideas in a PIN model. Civil society and NGOs were also invited to this workshop. The number of participants has been set at Forty (40).
- Preparation of communications: The CDM DNA has contacted several resources people to make presentations. These individuals were selected among structures belonging to the Designated National Authority under the existing regulations. These are among others, BNETD represented by Mr. N'GORAN K. Norbert, and also the greenhouse gas inventory focal point (IGES) represented by Mr. Lucien DJA. These people have always attended the activities of the CDM DNA and are competent in the matter. In addition, these individuals were selected on the quality of their Curriculum Vitae (see appendices, resumes of consultants and communicators).
- The selection of the main consultant of the workshop in the person of Mr. Houo DADJE was made on the basis of his seniority and his involvement at a high level in the climate change issue. He opened a consultancy firm (Agri-Dadjé) on issues of climate change and CDM.

2. WORKSHOP PROCESS

From **19 to 21 October 2010**, was held at the Manhattan hotel suites, located in Riviera Attoban, a national training workshop on the preparation of the Project Identification Note (PIN) and Project Design Document (RFP) under the Clean Development Mechanism (CDM).

This training workshop, organized by the National Authority for Clean Development Mechanism (CDM-NA) is one of the activities of the EC-ACP-MEAs capacity building project component on CDM, funded by the European Union with technical assistance from UNEP Risoe, which aims to encourage the development of CDM projects through the provision of technical and methodological tools to the CDM approach.

The objective of this workshop is to enable participants to acquire the necessary tools to develop PIN and PDD, the purpose of developing a national portfolio of eligible CDM projects for CDM financing, and enable Côte d'Ivoire to participate fully in the carbon market.

The workshop chaired by Mr. Abdoulaye CONDE, Technical Adviser, representing the Minister of Environment, Water and Forests was attended by the Director of ANDE, the representatives of UNDP and UNEP RISOE. Were also there representatives of several ministries, governmental departments and other civil organizations (see attendance list).

Four moments have marked this seminar, namely:

- a. Opening ceremony
- b. Communications
- c. Working Group
- d. Closing ceremony

a. Opening ceremony

Five speeches were delivered at the opening of the seminar. These interventions by the Director of ANDE, the CDM DNA National Coordinator, the Representative of UNDP, UNEP Risoie, the Representative of the Ministry of Environment, Water and Forestry.

a.1 Welcome by the Director of ANDE, Professor Joseph SEKA SEKA

The Director in his speech welcomed the participants before presenting the issues of climate change and the role of CDM in the fight against reducing greenhouse gas emissions. It also made the current point of CDM in Côte d'Ivoire and expressed his desire to see emerging from this workshop, participants well trained in drafting their PIN and PDD so that many CDM project ideas can further be developed.

a.2 Speech by the Coordinator of the AN-MDP in Côte d'Ivoire, Rachel BOTI-DOUAYOUA

Rachel BOTI-DOUAYOUA after proper warm welcomed the presence of all, put an emphasis on the existence of carbon funds set up by international bodies and especially by the industrialized countries (so-called polluters). She said the funds dedicated to finance CDM projects remain unused because of a rejection of projects to eligibility or a non-access to these funds. She noted that the number of failures can be attributed to a poor design of CDM project documents by projects developers. Also, to overcome this obstacle, a good design of project documents justifies this workshop. She wished to see for each project developer whatever the stage of his project a perfect mastery of the tools of PIN and PDD after a three-day's workshop. Tools that could serve for assessing work undertaken by cabinets, instead of developing one's own project. On these remarks, Madam Coordinator wished a good workshop to all.

a.3 Speech by the UNDP Resident Representative, Mrs. EMMA ANOH

During her speech, Mrs. EMMA ANOH expressed the availability of UNDP to support this initiative which aims at fostering national CDM project documents, which implementation is often a barrier to the Mechanism advancing. She also stressed the importance of CDM in the fight against climate change.

a.4 Speech by the Representative of UNEP Risoe Centre, Pr FAOUZI

Prof. Faouzi presented the activities of UNEP Risoe Centre that works to promote initiatives in the field of climate change and specifically the capacity building under the CDM for ACP countries. He also stressed the dynamism of the CDM DNA of Côte d'Ivoire, which has enabled the country to benefit from the project EC-ACP-MEAs and wanted to see more CDM projects registered by the CDM EB at the end of this program. He also called for awareness and involvement of financial institutions and all local stakeholders.

a.5 Speech by the Representative of the Minister of Environment, Water and Forests, Mr. Abdoulaye CONDE, Technical Advisor of the Minister

In his speech, Mr. CONDE presented the global environment linked to climate change and its consequences particularly in Côte d'Ivoire including downpours. He hoped that this workshop can contribute to effective capacity building of national stakeholders in the CDM, which is a real opportunity to fight against climate change. M. CONDE then declared open the seminar.

b. Establishment of a Chair committee

After the speeches, a chair committee was set up for further work. It was composed of:

President: Prof. Joseph SEKA Seka, Director of ANDE;

Reporters: Mr. Koumoin Arkadius, In charge of studies at BNETD and
Mr. Gerard D. Amani DEBLEZE, In charge of External Relations at the CDM
DNA.

c. History of the seminar

According to the agenda, the seminar continued with six communications in plenary. Thus, participants listened to successively:

- Mr. Lucien DJA, The National Coordinator of greenhouse gases inventories Project (IGES)
Presentation: "About the CDM: the Framework Convention on Climate Change and the Kyoto Protocol - progress and prospects (post-2012)"

- Mr. Norbert N'GORAN Konan, Chief of Energy Sector at BNETD.
Presentation: "The CDM modalities and procedures, and architecture"
Presentation: "CDM Market and Business Opportunities"

- Ms. Rachel BOTI-DOUAYOUA, CDM DNA National Coordinator
Presentation: "Assessment of the CDM DNA activities"

- Consultant AGRI DADJE CABINET, Mr. DADJE Houo
Presentation: "Development of a CDM project"
Presentation: "Understanding the important concepts of CDM projects"

c.1 Communication about CDM : the Framework Convention on Climate Change and the Kyoto Protocol - progress and prospects (post-2012)

The speaker, Mr. Lucien DJA, presented the origin of climate change, mainly due to the emission of greenhouse gas emissions. He also said that the IPCC have shown that without the greenhouse gas reduction, there would be serious consequences on populations and climate. According to the speaker, the IPCC's conclusions have raised awareness in the international community. Awareness that led to the signature in 1992 of the UNFCCC which emission reduction monitoring instruments were endorsed through the Kyoto Protocol in 1997.

Thus, the Kyoto Protocol defined three flexibility mechanisms including the Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) that allows developed countries said Annex I, meet their commitments by getting CER after investing in emissions reduction projects in developing countries.

The speaker also said that 2008 was the rise of CDM with 1,000 projects registered in but very few in Africa. Before concluding his presentation, the speaker reviewed the discussions on post-2012 regime, indicating that discussions on this new regime will continue.

c.2 Communication on the CDM modalities and procedures, and architecture

After describing the objectives and principles of the CDM, the speaker (Mr. Norbert N'GORAN Konan) indicated that the promotion of sustainable development is one of the key criteria for project eligibility to that mechanism. He presented during his speech the main stakeholders and their role in the CDM project cycle and explained a set of terminology needed to understand the functioning of the CDM process. He also compared the conventional project to the CDM project and highlights that sustainable development and carbon credits aspects are a feature of CDM projects. Finally, the speaker explained the process of CDM project management including the host country through the AN-MDP plays a crucial role.

c.3 Communication on the CDM market and business opportunities

Mr. Konan N'Goran Norbert presented a status of the global carbon market that records to date 2,439 projects registered at CDM EB for about 378 million tCO₂eq. He also said the low number of CDM project registered in Africa (of which only 1 in Côte d'Ivoire). This is due mainly to financial and regulations problems. He also outlined the main sectors involved in the CDM and projects that can be achieved in each area. Finally, the speaker presented the changes in the price of CERs and few existing carbon finance funds.

c.4 Communication on the “Point of the DNA activities”

The CDM DNA coordinator globally presented the point of CDM activities in Côte d'Ivoire. Since 2002, the DNA has benefited from two programs of capacity building program with ACP-EC-MEAs which includes the current seminar. She described the current organization of the DNA and indicated the activities carried out since 2003, including the ratification of the KP by Côte d'Ivoire in 2007 and developed several documents on CDM. She noted that at present 18 projects are in the CDM National Portfolio in which 3 are at an advanced stage (1 project registered). She also presented the weaknesses of CDM at the national level (institutional, regulatory and financial) and clear prospects for the future, visions can become reality by combining efforts.

c.5 Communication on the formulation of a CDM project

After presenting the different types of CDM project, the lecturer, Mr. Houo DADJE, made the distinction between large projects and small projects for which simplified methods have been developed. He also outlined the types of activities considered by CDM projects such as renewable energy, energy efficiency and other projects contributing to the reduction of GHG emissions. Thereafter, the speaker described the different approaches to setting up CDM projects and particularly comparing Bundling and programmatic CDM projects. Finally, the speaker presented the main documents of the CDM, the PIN and PDD by describing the

various components of these documents and their features. He also stressed on the specificity of PDD that must be written in English.

c.6 Communication on the presentation of important concepts of CDM projects

In this communication, Mr. Houo DADJÉ, CDM expert talked about the important concepts of CDM projects. He first explained the concept of baseline by presenting an illustration depicting its determination. He also emphasized on additionality of a CDM project which constitutes the greatest obstacle to the validation and registration of CDM projects. The speaker then explained the monitoring plan to be developed by the project sponsor and will serve as the validation by DOEs of the CERs produced. He finally ended his communication by presenting the main risks involved in the conduct of a CDM project, which must however be evaluated by the promoter from the planning phase of the project to mitigate risks.

d. Working groups

During the second day, 13 project ideas were identified, including 10 projects at the PIN stage and 3 projects at the PDD stage.

Thus, two working groups were formed to carry out practical exercises on drafting a PDD and a PIN under the guidance of instructors. The groups were constituted as follows:

PIN GROUP: 10 people with the Instructor, Mr. Houo DADJE

PDD GROUP: 4 people with the trainer, Mr. KASSI Bagaman

Before starting with the working groups, the trainers projected a PIN model fully completed.

The third day, **Thursday, October 21, 2010**, some participants did the restitution of their project. Following the presentations, several concerns have been raised, following which clarifications were made by trainers to enable project leaders to improve their project documents.

In addition to the tools received by the participants, Mr. Jacques KONAN Representative of BUREAU VERITAS, presented some instruments available at this international firm of quality control and their various sectors of intervention as Designated Operational Entities (DOE).

The participants expressed their satisfaction for having acquired mastery in PIN and PDD methodologies design which constitute CDM basic documents, and also see clarified the growth sectors of CDM projects and project types to be developed.

e. Closing Ceremony

The seminar ended with a closing ceremony presided by Mr. Jacques Koffi, Assistant Director, representing the Director of ANDE. Mr. Pierre DJOKOI, Master of Ceremonies, first received a standing ovation for the eminent persons who, since the beginning of the workshop shared their knowledge. They are Prof. Faouzi, MM.DADJE, N'GORAN and KASSI Bagaman, Consultants. Then a series of remarks followed.

Prof. Faouzi, taking first speech, noted the good organization of the workshop and the level of involvement of all. He also noted the excellence of Mr. Pierre DJOKOI as moderator. However, Professor recorded the absence of Internet in the conference room and the lack of board. He noted the good performance level increased from 25 to 40 participants during the three-day workshop. The use of Ivorian expert as trainers and the importance of following and push forward project ideas were encouraged. He stressed on the coming up of the Nairobi Framework to help Africa develop its capabilities. It's up to us, the torch is in our hands to raise the image of CDM in Africa, he added.

Ms. DOUAYOUA, Coordinator of the CDM, particularly thanked Professor FAOUZI who left from Denmark to attend that workshop. She also thanked all participants and consultants who involved themselves. While stressing that the workshop was not intended to replace the CDM DNA DOE, Ms. DOUAYOUA acknowledged the presence of BUREAU VERITAS, and apologies on behalf of the DNA for anything that could not be and assured everything will be done to improve future meetings.

Mr. Jacques KOFFI made profound thanks to Prof. Faouzi, Ms. DOUAYOUA, Technical Advisor of the Director of ANDE, Mr. Leopold KOUAHO, experts and participants. He complained on the fact that Côte d'Ivoire had recorded only project. However, ANDE itself is entirely at the disposal of the CDM projects stakeholders, through the DNA which it is the focal point. On that, he declared close the workshop on the "**Preparation of Project**

Identification Note (PIN) and Project Design Document (PDD) under the Clean Development Mechanism (CDM)."
