## **IMPLEMENTATION OF ACTIVITY**

From **02 to 03 August 2011**, was held in the Manhattan hotel suites, located in the Riviera Attoban, a workshop on improving the Sustainable Development criteria and the review of CDM approval procedure.

This workshop, organized by the National Authority for Clean Development Mechanism (CDM DNA), is part of the implementation of the second phase of the capacity building for Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) in Côte d'Ivoire called EC-ACP-MEAs project. It aims to review the sustainable development criteria and CDM projects approval procedure developed in 2005 so that to clarify the definition of terms for, firstly an objective assessment of the project and secondly, make approval procedures much more flexible.

The workshop was chaired by Dr. Remi Allah-KOUADIO, Minister of Environment and Sustainable Development and was attended by the representative of UNEP Risoe, the Director of ANDE, cabinet members of the department; General Managers, and Heads of Central Service. Were also present, representatives of state and other companies and organizations of civil society (see list).

The workshop was conducted through three (03) steps:

1. The opening ceremony
2. The work
3. The closing ceremony

### **1. Opening ceremony**

Four (04) speeches were delivered at the opening of the workshop. These are the interventions of the CDM DNA Coordinator, the Director of ANDE, the representative of UNEP Risoe and the Minister of the Environment and Sustainable Development.

#### **1.1 Message from the National Coordinator of the CDM DNA, Rachel BOTI-DOUAYOUA**

Ms. DOUAYOUA has in his speech thanked the Minister for agreeing to chair this workshop. She later stressed the importance of being able to measure the sustainability of a system which requires the determination of criteria and objective indicators. For her, well identified and adopted for 6 years now, the criteria of sustainable development through CDM projects should not be frozen in time but rather be dynamic. She ended her speech by thanking participants for attending this workshop.

## **1.2 Address by the Director of ANDE, Professor Joseph SEKA SEKA**

The Director in his address welcomed the participants before presenting the issues of climate change and the role of CDM in the fight against greenhouse gas emissions. It also presented the current results of CDM in Côte d'Ivoire and expressed his wish to see at the end of this workshop, objective criteria and indicators to assess CDM projects submitted.

## **1.3 Address by the Representative of the UNEP Risoe Centre, Professor TODD NGARA**

Professor Todd has the outset presented the activities of UNEP Risoe Centre, which works to promote initiatives in the field of climate change and specifically the capacity building in CDM in favor of ACP countries . He also stressed the dynamism of the CDM DNA of Côte d'Ivoire, which has enabled the country to benefit from the project EC-ACP-MEAs and wanted to see more CDM projects registered with CDM EB at the end of this program.

## **1.4 Address by the Minister of the Environment and Sustainable Development**

In his address, the Minister congratulated ANDE for holding this workshop now. He thanked the European Union, UNEP for their contribution to promoting sustainable development. He then declared open the workshop.

### 3. Workflow

#### ü First Day

According to schedule, the workshop continued with the presentation of the report on sustainable development criteria. The presentation was made by the National Coordinator of the CDM-DNA, Rachel BOTI-DOUAYOUA and turned around three points, namely: the definition of key terms (Sustainable Development, a criterion, an indicator Sustainable Development), the Proceedings of the workshop to validate the criteria of Sustainable Development of 2005, the deficiencies in the application of criteria and indicators for concrete projects submitted for approval and for thought.

Following the presentation, discussions and exchanges followed. These exchanges, criteria and indicators for sustainable development and their clarifications are given in the table below:

Exchanges and discussions helped to answer the main concern of the evaluators of CDM projects namely clarification of sustainable development indicators that were subject to various interpretations. All participants agreed by consensus on the best definition or clarification to be give to indicators. Similarly, some indicators were merged in the prospect of facilitating the approval process of CDM projects.

*Beside those discussions, the main recommendation from the participants was that quickly, sustainable development criteria and indicators by activity-sector, as considered by the CDM, should be set up in order to avoid any irrelevance of some indicators for some specific activity sectors, refining thus the CDM projects approval procedure. This recommendation should be subject of a call for applications for a consultancy on the topic.*

## ü Day Two

The second day was marked by the presentation of the CDM projects approval procedure. This presentation was made by the National Coordinator of the CDM DNA, Rachel Boti-DOUAYOUA. She reviewed some definitions for a better understanding of the formalities to be completed by the proponent prior to submission of the PDD; obligations of the CDM DNA, the approval procedure itself, and finished by the lacks identified in this procedure.

Following this presentation and the discussions and exchanges, it was arrested:

### ***Under the formalities required by the project sponsor:***

- The PDD must be written in French for the National Panel. But at the international level, only the version in English is required;
- The CDM DNA can perform the translation of the PDD at the request and paid by the project proponent;
- The developer must forward the PDD by mail with return receipt if the project proponent is not in the administrative district of Abidjan or through transmission specifications to the attention of the focal point of the CDM DNA located at its headquarters;
- Attach the reports of the Environmental Impact Assessment together with the Feasibility Study to the PDD;
- Complete the national CDM project's registration submission form and attach all the information mentioned in the form;
- Pay the consultancy fees of the national project approval procedure; the amount of these consultancy fees and payment terms will be notified by mail by the CDM focal point. Consultancy fees must be in CFA francs because the dollar cost varies. The rate is set at 5 million FCFA.

### ***Obligations of the CDM DNA:***

- Establish a national registry subdivided according to the CDM sectoral scopes for the registration of projects submitted and approved by the CDM DNA;
- Record the project mentioning the name, the project category and the title of the project promoter;
- Assign a code to any project registered;
- Ensure the confidentiality of the projects submitted to the CDM DNA for evaluation;
- Be in charge of selecting members of the panel of advisers (PCT) based on the sectoral scope of the proposed project and the competence of experts in that sector. The number of members of the PCT may vary depending on the type of project submitted;
- Communicate to the project developer the consultancy fees relating to the assessment of the PDD as well as payment terms;
- Respect the 30-day period for evaluation and approval of projects through the issuance of a letter of approval;
- issue the letter of approval to the project developer;
- Send a copy of this letter to the CDM Executive Board.

### *Concerning the tasks of the panel of advisers*

- Ensure that Environmental and Social Impact Assessment was conducted, where appropriate, by the project sponsor or other appropriate environmental assessment in accordance with the regulations in force;
- Ensure that the PDD is filled in correctly in relation to the approval procedure;
- Comply with National Requirements for Sustainable Development (CNDD).

After revising the CDM projects approval procedure, recommendations were made:

- An approval process document must be developed;
- The guarantee of confidentiality must be mentioned in the texts;
- Conflict resolution must be done at the administrative level through the focal point and the supervisory committee in the first instance, if a solution is not found, recourse to the court;
- Decisions of the panel must be known of the structures involved in the CDM process;
- A contract must be signed through a MOU between the CDM DNA and the promoter for projects approval payment.

### **4. Closing Ceremony**

The workshop ended with a word of thanks to Mr. Todd NGARA of UNEP Risoe who promised to support the National CDM Authority in its operations and closing remarks was delivered by Prof. SEKA SEKA Joseph, Director of the National Agency for Environment.

Dans le cadre de la mise en oeuvre de la deuxième phase du programme de renforcement des capacités des acteurs du Mécanisme du Développement Propre (MDP) en Côte d'Ivoire, l'Autorité Nationale du MDP (AN-MDP) organise les 02 et 03 août à Cocody Attoban, un atelier autour du thème : "Amélioration des critères de développement durable et révision de la procédure d'approbation des projets MDP". Selon le Pr Séka Séka Joseph, cet atelier vise l'amélioration des critères et indicateurs de développement durable dans l'optique du MDP. Pour lui, les critères nationaux de développement durable doivent être propres à chaque pays. Aussi a-t-il sou-

haité que ces critères une fois améliorés et adaptés, servent de boussole dans le processus du MDP en Côte d'Ivoire. Mme Rachelle Boti Douayoua, coordinatrice du MDP, a traduit sa reconnaissance à toutes les personnes qui vont travailler à améliorer les critères de développement durable et la procédure d'approbation des projets dans le cadre du MDP. Le Dr Allah Kouadio Rémi, ministre de l'Environnement et du développement durable, a félicité tous les acteurs des services publics et du secteur privé qui oeuvrent pour le développement du MDP en Côte d'Ivoire, mais aussi l'Union Européenne et le Programme des Nations Unies pour l'Environnement (PNUE), pour leur appui et leur contribution en tant qu'initiateurs.

## Environnement La Côte d'Ivoire fait le toilettage de ses textes

Le ministre de l'Environnement et du développement durable Dr Allah Kouadio Rémy, a présidé ce mardi, à Abidjan, un important atelier sur « l'amélioration des critères de développement durable et la révision de la procédure d'approbation des projets Mdp (mécanisme pour un développement propre) ». En effet, depuis 2006, existent en Côte d'Ivoire, des critères en la matière, sous l'impulsion de Unep Risoe et du Secrétariat de la Convention sur les changements climatiques. Mais ceux-ci ont besoin d'un toilettage pour s'adapter aux besoins nouveaux. C'est ce qui justifie, selon le directeur de l'Agence nationale de l'environnement, le Pr. Joseph Seka Seka, la tenue de cet atelier. Les critères nationaux de développement durable doivent, selon le directeur de l'Ande, être propres à chaque pays, c'est-à-dire, tenir compte de tous les secteurs d'activités spécifiques à la Côte d'Ivoire. Rappelant l'engagement de la Côte d'Ivoire à lutter contre les changements climatiques, le ministre de l'Environnement et du Développement durable, Dr. Allah Kouadio Rémy, a indiqué que le pays a « pris très tôt, à bras le corps, les questions relatives aux changements climatiques (Cnuec). Et adhéré au Protocole de Kyoto en 2007 ». Le pays s'est également engagé dans le Mdp, dès 2002, a-t-il souligné.

Aussi, a-t-il souhaité que ce séminaire soit un forum de diffusion et d'échange des concepts clés du

Mdp que sont « les mis à jour des critères de développement durable et de procédures d'approbation des projets Mdp en Côte d'Ivoire, vue de constituer un portefeuille consistant de projets à présenter lors des rencontres internationales du Marché du carbone ».

Le même jour, se tenait à l'initiative du ministère de l'Environnement et du Développement durable, dans un autre hôtel de la place, une autre rencontre visant à valider les projets de décrets d'application de la Loi portant Code de l'environnement. Les travaux portent sur le principe pollueur-payeur ; les conditions et modalités de gestion des déchets d'emballages et autres déchets industriels en application du principe pollueur-payeur ; à la bourse des déchets ; aux conditions financières relatives à la création d'une société pour la gestion des déchets ; à la création de l'Autorité du mécanisme pour le développement propre en abrégé (An-Dp) ; à l'évaluation environnementale, et à la transformation de l'Agence nationale de l'environnement (Ande) en un Etablissement public à caractère industriel commercial (Epic). Le résultat de ces travaux auxquels participent plusieurs ministères (Environnement, Industrie, Economie et Finances, Transport etc) sera soumis à l'approbation du gouvernement et devra le traduire en décret.

## Développement durable en Côte d'Ivoire Les critères bientôt à jour

PLUSIEURS EXPERTS ont rétroché du 2 au 3 août à la Riviera-Attoban dans le cadre d'un atelier sur "l'amélioration des critères de développement durable et la révision de la procédure d'approbation des projets Mdp". Pour le ministre de l'Environnement et du développement durable, Dr Allah Kouadio Rémy, "cet atelier se veut un forum de diffusion et d'échange des concepts clés du Mécanisme pour un développement

propre (Mdp) que sont les mises à jour des critères de développement durable et de procédure d'approbation des projets Mdp en Côte d'Ivoire, en vue de constituer un portefeuille consistant de projets à présenter lors des rencontres internationales du marché du carbone". Le ministre Allah a rappelé que selon l'Agence internationale de l'énergie, les émissions de dioxyde de carbone (Co2) ont atteint un niveau et triste record en 2010 et l'impossibilité

d'atteindre la limitation à 2 C 1 réchauffement climatique planétaire. Il a, par ailleurs, rappelé l'engagement de l'Etat de Côte d'Ivoire dans la lutte contre les changements climatiques. Le professeur Seka Seka Joseph, directeur de l'Ande, a indiqué, pour sa part, que les critères de développement durable élaborés et validés en 2006 par les différents représentants des parties prenantes ont malheureusement présenté quelques faiblesses d'où les ajustements à faire afin d'affiner la procédure d'approbation des projets Mdp en Côte d'Ivoire. Le coordonnateur de l'Autorité nationale Mdp, Rachel Boti Douayoua, a précisé que ces critères ne doivent pas être figés dans le temps mais être plutôt dynamiques. Todd N'gara, représentant de Unep Risoe, a recommandé que ce projet soit inscrit parmi les priorités du développement durable.
